# Vlogging tips and editing tools



## Tips for creating effective vlogs

### Planning:

- Plan out the vlog on paper first using a simple <u>storyboard template</u> to sketch out the scenes and plan an effective narrative
- Ensure the vlog is short, to the point and fulfils the learning outcomes
- Check the assignment brief to ensure that you have considered necessary assessment criteria
- Check to see if there is a written component and how this is to be submitted (either a group or individually)
- Be aware of filming subjects without permissions and/or sensitive information

### **Production:**

- Use a phone(s) with a good quality camera and microphone
- Plan to shoot scenes in similar (good) lighting conditions and quiet locations
- Use a gimmick or appropriate props to tell a story/narrative
- If multiple phones/cameras are to be used ensure one person can access them and be the dedicated editor to cut the scenes together
- If a single camera/phone plan the scenes to ensure a professional look (i.e. similar backdrops, or locations)
- Keep the camera steady during filming. Use a rest, doorframe, table, etc to lean on

### **Editing:**

- Use jump cuts or simple scene transitions to blend the video clips into a cohesive narrative
- Use free editing software / apps to add simple titles or text to enhance clips all done
  easily on a phone
- Export/save the video in a common format i.e. video.Mp4

#### Review and submission prep':

- Allocate enough time to review the final video to check for quality
- Allocate one person in the group to understand how to upload and share a video
- Use a cloud based platform (YouTube, Vimeo, or student MS Stream or OneDrive account) to share the video for assessment
- If the video contains sensitive or private content do not upload to public platforms (i.e. YouTube)

#### **Assignment submission:**

If using OneDrive, upload, then share video link to public. Then copy & paste link into a Word docx. Upload the .docx/.pdf to Moodle Assignment. You cannot upload the video file directly into the Moodle assignment. See the <u>guide on Moodle</u> help for sharing video clips via your MS OneDrive student account.

### **Tutor tips:**

- Consider setting up a private group in your MS Stream account to share and review uploaded videos: https://docs.microsoft.com/en-us/stream/portal-create-groups
- Allocate rubrics for assessing quality, content, group work, etc...
- Agree adequate methods to ensure written component is submitted (group or individual)
